What does *ActiveX* mean?

ActiveX is a framework for defining reusable software components (also known as ActiveX

controls) in a programming-language independent way. Because ActiveX encapsulates

specific functionality as ActiveX controls, it can be seamlessly incorporated into many

software applications. The Internet Explorer Web browser allows for ActiveX controls to be

embedded into Web pages. ActiveX controls officially run only in the Internet Explorer

browser running on a Windows operating system.

On the Internet, ActiveX controls have extended the capability to introduce lively and

elegant content, multimedia effects, interactive features to Web pages and software

applications. The extension provided by the ActiveX technology is limitless - ActiveX

controls have full access to the entire PC and all services of the Windows operating system.

With this power comes a responsibility to provide security to the user. Microsoft has

countered the potential risk of malware by developing a registration system that allows the

browser to identify and authenticate an ActiveX control before downloading it. In addition,

it is recommended that users set the default browser configuration such that they are

prompted to approve any request for the download and execution of ActiveX controls.
